REACH - Regional, Educational, Assessment, Crisis Response and Habilitation

Training based on the Memphis Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) model. It promotes a more professional, effective and humane response by law enforcement officers to individuals with mental illness. Major topics of study include: recognition of mental illness, psychopharmacology, on-site visits to local mental health facilities and crisis de-escalation skills. An important aspect of the training is the involvement of each partner agency. Mental health professionals from area mental health facilities, representatives from NAMI, and mental health consumers are all involved in the training
